## **Post-Operative Instructions**

Recovery following minor gynecologic surgery generally occurs rapidly, with minimal You should rest for the remainder of today. Then, gradually increase activities as tole following instructions will guide you through your recovery.	
<ul> <li>You may return to work in day(s).</li> <li>If you exercise regularly, gradually resume this in one week unless instructed</li> <li>Abstain from intercourse, douching, or placing anything in your vagina for</li> </ul>	
Remove Band-Aids tomorrow morning. Showers are permitted thereafter. Replace B only to absorb discharge from incisions. Leave underlying steri-strips in place until th a maximum of one week.	
Please be aware of the following potential problems:	
Pain:	
Take,tablets every hours as neemay also use Motrin <sup>®</sup> (Ibuprofen) 600mg every 6 hours, which is available without prescription medication your pain grows stronger and becomes unbearable, call your doctor. Bleeding:	

This will vary depending on the operation. Vaginal bleeding should not exceed a heavy menstrual period. If bleeding consistently saturates a pad every hour, call your doctor.



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## Infection:

If you feel warm or chilled, check your temperature. If you have a persistent fever greater than 101.5 °F or 38.5 °C for more than 6 hours, call your doctor. In addition, if you have a skin incision which becomes increasingly red or leaks pus, call your doctor.

## Bladder:

You should be able to empty your bladder every 6 hours. Please call your doctor if you are unable to void.

## **Bowels:**

Bowel movements may be delayed for a few days. You may use a laxative, like Milk-of-Magnesia according to package instructions, if constipation continues past the 3<sup>rd</sup> day after surgery.
